## THE OSNEY ISLAND OLYMPICS

WOW what a success! Over 200 people turned out to watch Lenny Lewis run down East St with the Osney Island Olympic torch followed by the arrival of the queen (dressed in the cast-offs of her forebear, Elizabeth I) by canoe paddled by a couple of servants. The Osney Mile (3 ½ times round the Island) was the opening event and the winners of each category was as follows: 12yrs and under Patrick Lloyd, South St; 13-35yrs Barney Shekleton, West Oxford; 35-60 yrs Quentin Sattentau, West St; and bus pass category (60+) Bob aged 62yrs. The parade of pimped ducks made its way down East St past the doping station, the plant, bric a brac and toys, book stalls and the displays of paintings, drawings and photographs, to the footbridge from where the duck race was launched (and won by Libby Martin aged 2). Running races, three-legged, egg and spoon, hobby horse dressage, the slow bike race and synchronised walking followed hot on the heels of one another and rising to a crescendo of spectacular egg throwing. All this and terrific live music and delicious cream teas too. The day finally came to an end with the tug o' war won by Team West St. Only then did it rain.

Quote of the day came from a passing cyclist who entered the slow bike contest on the spur of the moment and won, and said 'I wish I lived here'.

Many, many thanks to all those of you who entered races, cheered, made cakes and to all the gallant volunteers who gave up their time to help out and helped to make the day so memorable. Special big cheers should go to Annabel Dunstan of East St, whose idea it was and to Karen Brooks of Bridge St who came up with the goods time and time again. We are delighted to report the event raised a magnificent sum of £400 from the sale of ducks, T-shirts and mugs for the West Oxford Playground Fund. Here's to the next event!

We are currently putting together a book of the event which will go on sale in early September together with the chance to order individual photographs, watch a film of the event and hear Noughts and Crosses - the sensational band of young people headed by Megan and Lenny Lewis of East St (pending their availability, of course). Watch this space. Meanwhile if you didn't get round to buying a T-shirt we have seven 3-4 year old, six 5-6 year old and two 7-8 year old T-shirts, all now at £5 and two XXL T-shirts at £10 (they make good nighties!). *From Joyce Chalmers:* A production of Handel's Messiah was held in the West Oxford Community Centre on Sunday the 1st of July – a rare treat for anyone lucky enough to be able to attend. Modestly priced, it was a non profit event put on for the sheer joy of bringing it to the community.

The production was put together by Fiona Hedges, a local resident, who comes from a very musical upbringing and who teaches cello, piano, double bass and harmony at two schools in Oxford. A chance encounter with a friend generated a conversation about such an event and ended up with 'Why not put on a Community production of the Messiah?' So with the help of the West Oxford Community and donations of time, capital and gifts this production of The Messiah came into being.

Prior to the day, no rehearsals had taken place. The whole concert was rehearsed and given by West Oxford residents, experienced and not experienced alike, with help from Cumnor Choral Society singers, on the same day. This makes it very special – one day when the participants gave it their all and ended up in the evening with a great performance.

Fiona has stressed the importance of the community as a whole in making an event such as this happen. As well as whole families taking part in the chorus and in playing musical instruments, there was the inspirational input of the Director of Cumnor Choral Society, Peter Foster

who conducted, and four Oxford soloists with strong connections to West Oxford, Nicholas Clapton, Counter Tenor; Eleanor Calver, Soprano; Robin Whitehouse, Tenor; and Benjamin Thompson, Bass.

Fiona thanks everyone who took time out of their busy lives to make this happen and to those who gave material support. When asked if she would do it again, she said, she would be happy to and it would be at this time of year, just before families are off on summer holidays.
