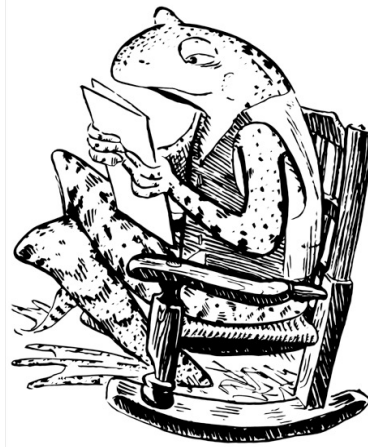
Children's Christmas lantern parade

From Joyce Chalmers: There are so many times, when Osney Island people have cause to consider ourselves so very fortunate to live here. We help each other out, we are aware of others' circumstances and offer security and sense of well being in that way.

My husband and I have lived here for many years off and on but for some reason have not gone to WOCCA the Harvest Supper until this year. We didn't know what we were missing! It is truly an old fashioned way of bringing people together and enjoying the abundance of local crops of vegetables from the allotments. It works like this: A group of trustees organise and execute the supper with additional help from everyone who is willing to pitch in later and help clear up. Delicious vegetarian food is provided, usually cooked by the café proprietor, or sometimes others. The result is a wonderful display of foraged autumnal decorations and delicious things to eat. It is a chance to see people you might know but don't see often, and to meet new people, have a laugh and go home feeling good with a full tummy. Thanks to all the good people who helped out.

Hugo Powell

We are very sad to report the death of Hugo Powell aged 92. Hugo had lived on the Island since 1969.

Louise Summers writes: On leaving art school at the end of the 1930s, Hugo Powell carried out commissioned sculptures from church figures to fireplaces in different media. He also designed the font for the plaques in Wembley that commemorate the 1948 Olympic Games. During this time he developed a breadth of skills and knowledge of materials that became evident when, as an artist, he seriously began making what he wanted to make. He produced an astonishing body of work, some of which can be seen at www.hugopowell.co.uk. An exhibition of his work was held at Christchurch in 1994. The art critic Bevis Hillier wrote that, in his profile relief self-portrait Hugo 'looked like a Roman Emperor on a coin'. In that respect it was certainly life-like as there was something very grand about Hugo and very delightful too. He will be much missed.
