The North St Railings

From 2,3 & 4 North St: Oxford Preservation Trust invited us to submit our new railings installed earlier this year, for a conservation award. The Oxford Times faithfully reported the event but LEFT OUT ANY MENTION OF OUR ENTRY! - so its down to me to report it. We didn't win the top award in our category (Small Projects) but came a good second along with mighty competitors such as the Ashmolean 19th c. galleries and Pembroke College Porter's Lodge. Just in case you are wondering it was not a matter of all short listed entries winning something so we did really well! It was a very smart reception and we three neighbours mingled fearlessly with all the great and good of the architecture world. We were given a tremendous introduction by Dr Malcolm Airs, chair of the awards panel, saying it was a 'terrific little project' and complemented us on banding together, doing our research and making a difference to North St.

Martin Hill of Ironcrafts of Stroud, who fabricated the railings, and Oxfordshire Gardens & Dry Stone Walls, who did the brickwork, got special mentions - as they should. We were also grateful to the Lowe family - older residents may remember old Mr Lowe who used

to live at No 4 - for lending us family photographs of the the houses when they were first built in the very early 20th century. One of conditions for installing the railings in this Conservation Article 4 area was that we had reproduce the original iron railings as closely as possible. They were taken down in WWII to help the war effort and like all such railings, when they proved of the wrong type of metal, were dumped in the sea somewhere. If anyone else feels so inclined to restore their railings, please get in touch and we can advise you on possible pitfalls. At least you won't have to first prove there were once railings on the Island as we had to do.

A big welcome to our new lock keeper

The new Lock Keeper at Osney Lock is Mark Winks. Born and bought up in the Thames Valley he has spent almost all his career involved in Inland Waterways, initially working on pleasure craft, then tug driving and, for the past 12 years in Oxfordshire, as Resident Lock and Weir Keeper of Northmoor Lock. In his time at Northmoor he worked closely with the local community on issues such as flood defence and land drainage and is looking forward to building a similar relationship with the residents of West Oxford.

West Oxford gets its own Farmers' Market!

From Anne James: St Frideswide Church is delighted to be hosting a new and fun West Oxford Farmers' Market. So do put Saturdays, 12th November and 3rd December in your diaries now! The markets will run from 10 - 1 on each of those Saturdays. The 12th November market will be opened by Oxfordshire food writer and chef, Helen Peacocke.

The markets are being organised by Caroline Casey, who will be well known to people who enjoy her markets at Woodstock, North Parade and Jericho. Stall holders include The Cotswold Game and Meat Company, who provide game as in season and this autumn that will include a wide spectrum ranging from red legged partridge and mallard to muntjac deer and hare not to mention pheasants' and gulls' eggs! Also present will be The Cheese Makers Choice, who are selling cheese making kits, so you really can try this one at home, Clive's famous Sandford pies will be on sale, plus preserves, chutneys and confectionary from Faringdon's Larder and Tuck Box, with more quality goodies, both traditional and contemporary from Sweet Fancies, and artisanal breads from Breadbyan. As well as food there will be high quality crafts, felted goods and fabric toy bags, beautiful cards and gift wraps on sale. This is an intentionally inter-active market so there will be advice and recipes on hand, a pigeon plucking workshop and the chance to try your hand at spinning wool into yarn. And this month the alpacas, who proved such a hit at the October market, will be joined by some inquisitive lamas.

In addition, St Frideswide will be open (as will its loos and baby changing) providing the opportunity to explore this beautiful Grade II* Listed building and to see the 'Alice' door, a door which was carved in the 1930s by Alice Liddell, the original Alice, of Alice in Wonderland.
