From David Jeffrey: All residents of West Oxford are invited to the "Big Picnic", a community event being held on Saturday 17 June from 4pm to 7pm in Botley Park, next to the West Oxford Community Centre. Bring your own picnic and enjoy it in the company of family, friends (old and new) and neighbours. There will also be a stall selling some of the beers that will be on offer at the West Oxford Beer Festival later in the evening. Music will be provided from 6pm by local band, Bötley Crüe.

The 'Big Picnic' is part of a series of nation-wide events called the 'The Great Get Together', celebrating the vibrancy of our local communities and inspired by the words of the late Jo Cox MP: 'we have more in common than that which divides us'. In that spirit, her family and friends are inviting people across the country to mark the anniversary of her death by organising or attending a celebration in their community on 17-18 June. There is no entrance fee, no ticket, just bring a picnic, maybe something to drink, a rug, a chair, your family, friends, neighbours, good cheer and a bit of sunshine.

As well as old friends, why not bring along some new ones? The 'Great Get Together' is all about bringing communities together. So invite the person you are on nodding terms with from down the street, whose name you don't know. Or the people who have just moved in a few doors along. You can also make friends at the event. Don't be shy, start chatting to the people on the next rug. Even if you don't need a chair yourself, why not bring one or two along, in case someone else does. A picnic in the park – what a great way to make new friends.

What happens if it rains? As with all picnics, this is an outdoor event and will be dependent on the weather. If it rains a little: bring an umbrella. The Boat Club

From Simon Stubbings: Despite the dismal boating weather outside, the Osney Island Boat Club held a convivial AGM in the Punter on Wednesday 26 April. Rob Bennett was thanked for his work in improving the environment for towpath users by re-painting the doors of the boat shed. These had become daubed with graffiti. In the process of making individual plans for the summer, it was agreed to set aside a weekend morning in June to clear any waste that has accumulated in the streams around the Island. (Last year we came back with a magnificent haul of half a dozen footballs!) The annual Boat Club Outing was also discussed and fixed for 3 September 2017. The fees for 2017/18 were confirmed at £25 membership fee (per household) and £50 boat storage fee. Although there are currently no vacant spaces for storing a boat in the shed, the club now owns four

craft which are available free of charge to members. These comprise: a Canadian canoe, a regular kayak, and two smaller kayaks. In addition to the membership fee there is a one-off, non-refundable, joining fee of £30.

Dastardly Japanese knotweed

From Quentin Sattenau: Himalayan balsam or Japanese Knotweed (Impatiens glandulifera) is a relative of the busy Lizzie, but reaches well over head height, and is a major weed problem, especially on riverbanks and waste land and can also invade gardens. It grows rapidly and spreads quickly, smothering other vegetation as it goes.

I am suggesting that any interested readers of the newsletter might want to get together on one afternoon/ evening in late June/early July to eliminate some areas where this plant has colonised, particularly along waterways. I will suggest a possible date and a place to meet via the Osney Island Email list shortly.
