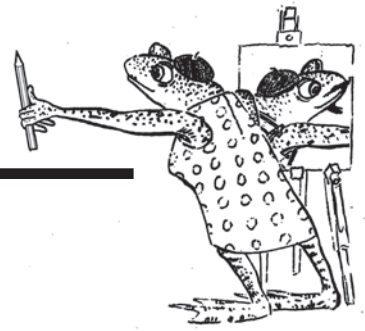

Oxford Canal Festival

Allotment rent days

Allotment rents are due as usual on the first three Sundays in September i.e. September 3, 9 and 16. You can pay your rent at the Association shop (on the Twenty Pound Meadow site) between 10am and 12pm. A full plot costs £25 for the 2018-19 and a half plot costs £12.50. Cheques can be accepted and should be made payable to: Osney St Thomas & New Botley Allotments Association. Please remember to pay your rent on time as if the Committee have to chase people for rent it becomes very time-consuming. Indeed, the rules allow the Committee to charge late payment fines and we are actively considering this as an option.

We strongly encourage you to pay your rent in person so that if there is anything we need to discuss with you concerning your plot, we have the opportunity to do so. If you cannot make any of the available dates, then please make alternative arrangements or contact one of the Committee members.

OSNEY ISLAND NEWS AND VIEWS

East Street Yoga Studio

From Susanna Pressel: In my 'supplement' I wrote about the planning application for a three-storey yoga studio at 16 East Street. There has also been a lot of correspondence about this in the email group, with strongly expressed views, both for and against.

Since writing my page, I have heard that the planning officers have decided to refuse permission for the current proposals. The grounds for refusal are connected with design and flooding issues. The officers have no concerns about 'the principle of the development'. More details will be available quite soon, when they have written their report. The application will now not be coming to the planning committee.

The applicant can contest the decision, in which case it would be decided by a government inspector. Perhaps more likely, he could choose to change some aspects of the proposals and submit a new application. Bikes, birds and fish on Mull

From Robert Lawrence: Returning to Mull after an absence of 35 years was an intriguing prospect. What would I remember from my first serious bike tour back then? Very little it turned out, other than the multi-

coloured waterfront at Tobermory, and the Scottish 'smir'. My initial reaction was relief - Susan and I had escaped the Oxford heatwave - and the rain on arrival was welcome. Mull remains blessedly peaceful despite being a popular holiday destination now, and off the beaten track the roads are narrow, quiet, and surfaces are generally better than back home. There is some serious climbing in prospect, and the road between Dervaig and Tobermory on the north eastern corner of the island is not for the faint-hearted (or the over-gear). Spectacular views are to be found on the western coastal roads and especially near Lagganulva where sheer cliff rock abuts the road at the water's edge and there are sightings of Ulva and minor Inner Hebridean islands. When not riding, I was eating, and fresh fish is a staple. Mull has a Les Routiers fish-and-chip van at Tobermory, where there is invariably a queue and a wait on ordering as fish is cooked on demand. Upmarket is the Am Birlinn restaurant between Dervaig and Calgary and my scallops, grilled swordfish steak, and sticky toffee pudding were exemplary, and riding a bike means you can eat like this with a clear conscience. A day off saw us take a boat to Staffa and Fingal's cave and its astonishing vertical basalt rock columns. The other Staffa attraction is its puffin community with their weird triangular beaks, striking yellow feet, and thrilling diving displays. An excellent week's stay near Dervaig then, but would I visit Mull a third time? Certainly, though a glance at a map of Scotland's west coast is an invitation to an extended tour of its islands. Next stop Islay?

Osney Energy Club

From *Andy Edwards*: Would you like to join an energy club that gives you cheaper electricity and access to local renewable power? Osney Lock Hydro have teamed up with Energy Local and Bioregional to setup an 'Energy Local Club' on Osney Island. The team are looking to recruit 45-55 island residents to be part of this pioneering scheme. Members of the Club will be able to buy cheaper power when their energy use matches generation from the islands hydro turbines. Members will need to switch their energy provider to Co-operative Energy who take care of the billing. In return, participating households will receive a free 'advanced meter' which gives access to an online dashboard showing their households energy use in relation to the Osney Lock Hydro's energy generation. Being part of the club will cut out the middle man, reducing household electricity bills and keeping more money in the local economy.

The scheme would be the first of its kind in England, following a successful trial in north Wales with over 100 households. The project is made possible by funding from the European Union through the OxFutures programme. To find out more please contact, osney@energylocal.co.uk

Tips for secondary glazing

From *Quentin Sattentau*: Last Autumn I added secondary glazing to all the sash windows on the front elevation of our house on West Street using pre-cut UV treated polycarbonate sheet and magnetic strip. It took about an hour and cost about £85 per window, and seems to make a big difference in heat loss and sound insulation. The panels are essentially invisible and can be taken off in seconds for storage when not needed.
