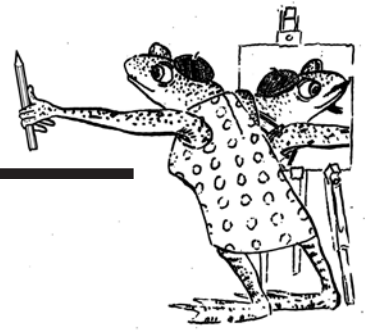

ISLAND NEWS AND VIEWS

Silent skies

Mick Bayliss in East Street is our resident bird expert – he even helps David Attenborough out. Mick has kindly agreed to write a regular spot on birds for the newsletter. Here he describes the noticeable absence of swifts above Osney this year.

During the first four days of May there is a growing anticipation of the arrival of the very first swifts in the skies above Osney. In the main, this species is a truly urban bird seeking a hole or crevice to raise a brood in the Victorian buildings that surround us. Numbers build up rapidly as new migrants arrive from African wintering grounds until they collect and swarm around the rooftops with infectious screams of delight while offering great entertainment in their aerial agility. The banks and swerves by tight groups over canyons of brick streets can hardly go unnoticed or be overlooked. Such doyens of the air reflect their ability to remain airborne for most of their lives- even sleeping on the wing.

But this year, the skies were empty of swifts for most of May and it was not until May 12 that the first one was seen. Unseasonable severe weather over the Mediterranean in May (when Corsica had snow) may have held them up. Eventually, five birds were spotted on a warm summer evening on June 29. In over 50 years of living in the neighbourhood, I've not recorded such a paucity of sightings. Sadly, the UK population has fallen 45-50% over the past 20 years. The RSPB suggest that home improvements have led to a decrease in available nest sites. But there are specially designed next boxes available which may redress the balance if used sufficiently. This year will probably not witness the scores of young birds joyously

crowding the skies in August. Will it be like this next year... silence again?

Next up kites over cuckoos?



Swifts

Homemade rhubarb cordial

The latest in our occasional recipe for allotment produce.

You will need:

2 kg rhubarb
2 large oranges or 3 lemons
8 whole star anise
600-1200g granulated sugar depending on taste
citric acid (available from Boswells)

- Put the rhubarb in a large pan and add approx. 1.5 litres of cold water (don't cover it completely because it will dilute the flavor too much) and approx. 4 or so strips of orange or lemon peel or both.
- Bring to the boil, turn down heat and simmer gently until the rhubarb is soft. Cool.
- Pour everything into a large jelly bag and allow to drip overnight.
- Pour the juice into a pan and add the sugar. Stir until the sugar has dissolved.
- Add two teaspoons of citric acid if you want to store it for a couple of months.
- Pour into sterilised bottles. Great diluted with Prosecco. Cheers!
